

# Author Guidelines

**Authors are required to follow all the instructions listed under General and Required category for final submission of their manuscript to Springer.**

## Evaluation Criteria

A peer review process will be used to evaluate all papers submitted for consideration. If a paper is accepted, at least one author needs to register and present the paper.

Your submission will be double-blind reviewed by at least two independent reviewers. The decision on your paper will be informed according to the schedule.

## Plagiarism Policy

Plagiarism refers to the use of another individual's research work, ideas, figures, or textual content without proper acknowledgment of the original author and source. Any form of plagiarism is strictly unacceptable and considered unethical, and may lead to serious consequences, including rejection of the manuscript and possible legal action.

All submitted manuscripts must adhere to the plagiarism policies established by the publisher. The overall similarity index must be below 10%, and the use of AI-generated content is strictly prohibited.

The Technical Program Committee (TPC) may, at its discretion, allow authors to revise and resubmit their manuscripts if the detected plagiarism is deemed unintentional and the underlying research demonstrates originality and novelty. However, this provision should not be misinterpreted as encouragement or tolerance of plagiarism under any circumstances. If at any stage find AI tool content, the paper will be rejected even after successful registration.

## Submission Guidelines

### 1. Manuscript Size

Each manuscript submitted should constitute outstanding and solid advancement in the conference scope and allied disciplines. The main content of the submission should range from 10-12 pages as per the publisher's format. The references should be limited to 50 and abstract should be limited to 250 words maximum.

### 2. MANUSCRIPT COMPONENTS

Each manuscript should include following components, presented in the order shown.

- a) Title, name, affiliation of each author and corresponding author's email should be included in the title page.
- b) Abstract. A brief, concise abstract is required at the beginning of each manuscript. The abstract contains a brief account of the background and rationale of the work, followed by a statement of the main conclusions. The abstract is typically 250 words or less in length and is unreferenced. The abstract should not contain any mathematical expressions, if possible, should include no footnotes or citations, and should not contain first-person sentence structure.
- c) Keywords. 4 – 6 keywords should be provided.
- d) Text. The text (12-point) should be typeset in one column, divided into sections, each with a separate heading and numbered consecutively using following format:
  - Primary heading
  - Secondary heading
  - Tertiary heading
- e) Acknowledgements. Keep this section as brief as possible by acknowledging only direct assistance in your research and writing. Financial support for the work done should be acknowledged here rather than as footnotes to the title.
- f) Formulas. Brief equations or terms set inline in text must be set as a single line expression, if possible. Also please enter them directly from the keyboard if possible.

For more complex variables that have both subscripts and superscripts or have a more complicated operator such as a radical sign, use of the MathType equation editor is recommended.

- g) Figures. Vector-based figures (eps., ai., or psd.) should be provided upon acceptance of a paper.
- h) References: As per the attached format.

**General instructions:**

- 1. Authors are required to remove header and footer (if there any) in their Final Camera-ready manuscript.
- 2. Do not put any page numbers in the Camera-ready manuscript.
- 3. **Remove the titles like (Prof., Dr., Mr., Ms., etc.) before the author's name(s)**
- 4. Remove hyperlinks (if there any) in the final version of the manuscripts
- 5. Format the paper using Springer standard template.

**Important Dates:**

- 1) CAMERA READY/FINAL MANUSCRIPT (on or before October 31, 2026)
- 2) Springer form via email received from acceptance mail (on or before October 31, 2026)
- 3) Registration form Duly completed (on or before October 31, 2026)

**1. Springer PDF format CAMERA READY SUBMISSION**

- **STEP 1:** Revise your paper(s) according to the reviewers' comments failing which it will be REJECTED.
- **STEP 2:** Download the Springer Camera Ready Template for AIST-2026.
